Barry's Journey

From Darkness to Purpose

Barry's story began in a home where fear overshadowed love. "Our father was physically abusive to my mother and verbally abusive to us kids. Safety was nonexistent for me," he recalls. To escape, he turned to the streets, where he found the acceptance he lacked at home. "It wasn't in a positive way, but it was better than home"

As years passed, drugs and addiction took hold. "I hid it for a long time, but eventually, it caused friction at home. When my relationship fell apart, I ended up homeless." Moving from shelters to the streets, Barry struggled to break free. "Even though drugs were ruining my life, they were the only thing that gave me relief—until they made me feel worse than ever."

When he first came to Oliver Gospel, Barry wasn't sure what to expect. "Somebody told me, 'Go downtown. There's a shelter.' That's how I found this place. I started in the Refresh program and eventually entered recovery." But the journey wasn't linear. "I didn't stay the course. I backslid. I spent the next few years bouncing between shelters, relationships, and the streets."

Then came a turning point. "I was looking for a program to help me get clean. I wanted to leave the city, start fresh somewhere else. But when I asked for advice, someone said, 'Why don't you just come here?' It was like a light flipped on. This is where I was supposed to be."

This time, Barry fully committed. "I got a sponsor. I connected with a church. I did the hard work of recovery. Before, I didn't want to do the things they recommended because it made me uncomfortable. But I decided to do what I had never done before—put my whole heart into recovery and Christ."

One of the biggest blessings was rediscovering his passion for cooking. "I helped in the kitchen, doing dishes, preparing meals. It got me back into the groove of working in a kitchen, where I've spent most of my career." That opportunity led to employment, and today, Barry serves those who walk the same road he once did. "Some of the guys coming in now are people I used to get high with. Now, I'm the one serving them meals."

Looking forward, Barry dreams of owning a fleet of food trucks. "I want to generate wealth, leave something for the next generation, and continue being a blessing. That's what matters to me now."

"I wish I would have had this mindset sooner, but my story's already written. No point in looking back—today is all that matters."
